Home Learning

Home learning is an important part of school life and children may continue to need support during these tasks. It is especially important this year as it will start to get them ready for the work set at secondary school.

Home learning will include:

Reading – every night for 10-15 minutes please. This is vital in year 6 and it would help your children greatly if you listened to them, and asked them questions about their books. Discuss complex vocabulary and the contextual meaning. The children will write in their reading records where they have read up to in their book.

Spellings - Your child will be taught a new spelling rule each week and then given some online spellings using 'Spelling Shed' to practice. They will be given out on Monday and then tested the following Monday.

Maths- Maths home learning will be set every Friday this will either be on Maths shed or a written activity e.g. an arithmetic quiz or reasoning questions.

Topic home learning - given every two weeks. See next page for details.

This term we will be working on building the children's confidence as young authors and developing writing around our topic.
