#### Home Learning and Library

Please can reading books and Home School Link books come to school **every day**. The phonics and tricky words for the week (common excetion words) are sent home on Fridays. Reading books will be collected in on a Thursday and returned on a Friday. Please check the separate homework grid.

#### Healthy Snack

Please ensure your child's snack is a **small healthy** snack, preferably some fruit, they only have about 5/10 minutes snack time to eat it. Also only put water in water bottles please.

### Poetry about animals

- Identifying and comparing the features of fiction and non-fiction texts.
- Information texts and simple narratives
- Reading, phonics, handwriting, sentence punctuation

#### <u>Maths:</u>

English:

- Place Value to 50. Representing numbers to 50, estimating on a number line, one more and one less.
- Measurement Length and Height Comparing, describing and solving practical problems for length and height. Measuring and comparing mass volume and capacity.

#### <u>Science:</u>

 Animals including humans - How do we group animals with the same characteristics?

#### R.E:

- What do Christians learn from stories about Jesus?
- Exploring the Easter Story and the thoughts and feelings of the different people involved. Exploring the meaning of the symbols of Easter.

<u>D.T:</u> Exploring different types of houses including common shapes and features.

<u>Geography</u>: . Finding our way around school and creating maps. Looking at aerial photographs of the local area.

### Helping your children with their writing

As the children reach the middle of year 1, it is clear to see the progress they have made in their learning. Reading often 'takes off' this term whilst many children find writing more of a challenge. Here are some tips to support your children at home with their writing.

Provide a place for your child to write.

Read, read, read! The best way to improve writing is through reading, both reading a daily bedtime story and also listening to your child read. It exposes your child to vocabulary that they can 'magpie' for their own writing.

Encourage your child to keep a journal or diary. Write a shopping list. Write a message for a member of the family.

Be a writing role model - make sure your child sees you write.

Teach your child new words each week and encourage them to use them. Use the tricky words in a sentence.

Celebrate and share their writing with others.
