### Home Sweet Home. Where does your favourite animal live? Discover its habitat!



Find out about your favourite animal's habitat. Where is it? What does it look like? How does their habitat help them to survive? What does your animal do in their habitat? Please present your findings in an interesting way like a poster, fact file or booklet. You may want to research your animal's habitat by using books or the internet (with adult supervision!).

### Make an array!



Have a go at making an array from things around the house. This could be printed lego bricks, egg boxes or cut and stick circles. Label your array with the multiplication and division sentences that it represents. Remember it can represent the 10, 5, 2 or 3 times tables.



### I like to move it move it!



#### How can I make things move?

Can you build a toy so that it moves? Does it need wheels? Can it be pulled by string? Can it float on water or glide through the air? You can choose whatever you like to make your toy; from construction sets to any kind of recyclable materials.



### Keeping Healthy

As part of our PSHE work on Health and Wellbeing can you complete one of the following:



\*Plan and cook a healthy and nutritious recipe, snack or meal. Write down the ingredients you used and take some photos to show us of you making your culinary creation.

\*Create a simple exercise routine of between 5 and 10 exercises. Record the name of each exercise, how to complete it and how many times it should be repeated, e.g., 5 star jumps, running on the spot for 20 seconds etc.

### Easter Symbols - What Christian beliefs can you share about Easter?



Create an Easter Garden that contains some of the symbols associated with Easter, e.g., a cross, a tomb, flowers showing new life. Be prepared to talk about your garden explaining some of the symbols you have used and what they reflect.



### All About Books!



In celebration of World Book Day, create a book quiz. This could include questions based on well-known books, authors and/or characters. You could include a range of short answers and multiple-choice answers. Bring in your quiz and we will look forward to completing it. Alternatively, read and choose a favourite poem. Write it out, decorate it and practise reading it. Bring it in to share with the class.
