This half term you are going to choose two of the projects below. They will be due in on the following dates: **Monday 29<sup>th</sup> April and Monday 13<sup>th</sup> May**. If you would like to do more than two projects, please feel free.

<p><b>How can we look after our teeth?</b></p> <p>Make a leaflet or fact file to encourage and explain to people how best to look after their teeth. Make it colourful and informative.</p>	<p><b>Can you capture the movement of water?</b></p> <p>Take some photos of water e.g. water ripples on a lake or try and capture the movement of water e.g. from a tap/hose/fountain.</p> <p>Display your water photos in a collage, either in digital or paper form.</p>	<p><b>What can you tell me about famous rivers of the world?</b></p> <p>Either choose a river of interest in the UK or wider world and create a poster about it. You could include, pictures, photos and interesting facts about it. Record information in a fun and informative way, e.g. fact boxes, bullet points, <i>Did you know?</i> boxes, quick quiz questions.</p>
<p><b>Can you create a model of a river?</b></p> <p>Design and make a 3D model of a river, from source to mouth. Can you label it with its different features too? e.g. ox bow lake, meander, tributary.</p>	<p><b>What helps you to learn about fractions and decimals?</b></p> <p>Design a board or card game to help improve and revise your understanding of fractions and decimals, i.e. an equivalent fraction pairs game, a decimal and fraction equivalent Bingo game.</p>	<p><b>Can you name and locate some UK rivers or rivers of the world?</b></p> <p>Draw or trace a UK or world map, drawing on and labelling some famous rivers of the UK/world. You could also include some interesting facts about two or three of the rivers on your map.</p>
