# Home Learning

Home learning is a very important part of school life and the children will continue to need your support to complete their tasks.

# Tasks will be:

- 1) Reading Please read aloud with your child at least 3 times a week (every night if possible).
- 2) **Spellings** On a Tuesday, your child will be taught a new spelling rule and then given some online spellings using 'Spelling Shed' to practise. They will be tested the following Tuesday.
- 3) **Times tables** -We will continue to practice and consolidate times tables knowledge daily in school. Please continue to practice at home.
- 4) Maths home learning home learning will be set on Friday every week. This will be a few pages from the Maths Practice Journal to consolidate learning. It will be due in the following Wednesday.
- 5) **Topic homework** given every two weeks. See home learning grid for details. Children share their home learning to the class when completed.
