Ebola virus

- ▣ In 2014 the country was hit by the Ebola Virus, more than 11,000 people died and the country is still trying to recover.

Population

- ▣ Sierra Leone has a population of just over 7.5 million people. The average life expectancy is just 54 years' old
- ▣ Only 48% of the population over the age of 15 can read and write.
- ▣ English is the official language spoken at schools, government administration and in the media. Krio (a Creole language) is the most widely understood in virtually all parts of Sierra Leone.
- ▣ Only 2% of Sierra Leone's population are followers of the traditional African religions 21% are Christian and 77% are Muslim.

Economy

- ▣ Over 70 per cent of Sierra Leoneans live on less than £42 a month some earning only 3 pence an hour.
- ▣ Since the end of the civil war, outside assistance has helped Sierra Leone begin to recover. Fishing and tourism are becoming increasingly important.
- ▣ The currency is the Leone; at the time of writing (October 2018) £1 is worth over 11,655 Leones.
